For the month of July, The Laguna Vista Volunteer Fire Department responded to 25 EMS calls for service and 3 fire calls.

The fire calls included one smoke detector activation caused by cooking smoke


One motor vehicle collision with no injuries.

One fairly large fuel spill at the Stripes. Vehicle drove off with the diesel fuel pump still in the vehicle.

On O7/18, Training was conducted on the proper procedure for administering the HyFin Vent (sucking check wounds), and then the proper usage of the new LP15 monitor. The new monitor recently went into service and is a tremendous advantage when performing patient assessments.

On July 26th the construction of a new sleeping quarters was begun on the second floor of the fire station. The new area will accommodate sleeping for two EMS Personnel, wardrobe lockers for our current staff, and a storage area for station supplies. Renovations are nearly complete and were performed at a minimum impact on the budget.

I am extremely proud of the steps we have taken to improve the level of service for our citizens. In the past year we have; added a full time EMS staff, are in the process of upgrading medical protocol to greatly increase the level of care we can provide to our citizens, we have improved our ISO rating from a 5x to a 4, we are anticipating future growth of services provided by proactively constructing sleeping quarters for EMS personnel, and ideas are in the works for the construction of a building addition that would accommodate ambulance parking. I look forward to many more new projects and improvements to the level of service Laguna Vista is able to provide to its citizens.





RIGHT OF WAY & EASEMENTS



The public right of way is property dedicated to the city for public infrastructure like roadways, storm sewers, sidewalks and streetlights. The state also allows utility providers to use the public right of way for their facilities.

Utility easements* are areas of a property dedicated for utilities to deliver services such as electricity, gas, water, sanitary sewer, telephone, internet and cable.

The land belongs to the homeowner, but utilities can access easements to perform routine maintenance, construct emprovement projects and repair utility lines during emergencies.

*Not all properties have utility easements in the same location. The ones included in this illustration likely do not reflect where the ones on your property may be. All easements should be shown on the title work and plot plan provided at the time your property was purchased.

ORDINANCE NUMBER 2007-29

Tall grass, weeds, and other rank vegetation.

Zoned Residential or Commercial District shall not allow grass or weeds, to grow upon the premises to such an extent as to become a health or fire hazard or to a height in excess of eight (8) inches in any location thereon.

ORDINANCE NUMBER 2008-32

The "easement" is a right the property owner has granted to the utility company (water, sewer, gas or electricity) or the municipality. Though granted, the property owner nonetheless maintains ownership of the property where the easement is located as well as responsibility for its maintenance. An easement may be located adjacent to the property and/or across or through the frontage, rear or side of the property.




