The month of December 2023, Laguna Vista Police Department responded to 140 calls for police service in the Town of Laguna Vista. In December officers conducted traffic enforcement activities that resulted in 209 traffic stops being conducted. As a result, 91 citations were issued to appear in municipal court and 118 warning citations were issued during this time period.

Highlighted events:

Five domestic disturbances.

Two DWI arrests.

One arrest for littering and dumping.

Responded to 36 medical calls.

Enforced 31 ordinances.

One arrest for possession of a controlled substance.

One traffic accident was investigated.

Significant events:

The LVPD has stepped up patrol in the neighborhoods within the Town due to the holiday season.

The LVPD is working on two federal grant programs during the month of November and December.

The LVPD is scheduled to receive the Panasonic tough books this month.

PROCLAMATION

WHITELAS, the Laguna Vista Police Department, Laguna Vista Emergency Medical Services, and the Laguna Vista Volunteer Fire Department responded to an emergency at a residence in the Town of Laguna Vista; and,

WHEREAS, upon arrival, emergency personnel located one victim staggering in the doorway, disoriented and confused; and

WHEREAS, the emergency personnel quickly accessed the emergency situation and made entry into the residence to locate the remaining two residents and quickly transported them outside to fresh air; and,

WHEREAS, after the residents were out of the house, the building was accessed and it was determined that the residents' symptoms were consistent with carbon monoxide poisoning; and,

WHEREAS, emergency personnel secured a carbon monoxide reading in the building, obtaining a reading of 240 parts per million of carbon monoxide, a dangerously high level, and,

WHEREAS, due to their rapid response and quick actions, Laguna Vista's first Responders avoided and prevented a catastrophe and saved the lives of the people they are here to serve.



LIBRARY POLLINATOR GARDEN

NATIVE MILKWEED

In November the RGV
Pollinator Project was able
to successfully plant
native milkweed at the
Library pollinator gardern.



A total of 12 plants were placed throughout the beds of the pollinator garden at the Laguna Vista Library. Eight of these were mature and part of our relocation effort to move native milkweed from sites pending development into places like this garden so they stay in the area to continue to serve our pollinators. The other four (located at the west end) are young seedlings we have grown from seed. We will monitor them to see how well they grow at this stage.







HOLIDAYS

The South Texas Ecotourism Center has partnered with "Tu Salud Si Cuenta", a community health program sponsored by the UTHealth Houston School of Public Health that presents free health and exercise classes for the public. RGV Pollinator Project
