# Plants for Wildlife: Flame Acanthus + Mistflower

Native perennials flame acanthus and Gregg's mistflower withstand Texas heat and drought, and continue to bloom year after year.

Flame acanthus is covered in tubular red flowers summer through fall, supporting hummingbirds, butterflies and other pollinators that find them irresistible.

Gregg's mistflower sports clusters of pale purple flowers that are a magnet for monarchs and other butterflies – plus birds eat their seeds.

Check anywhere native plants are sold for these 2 popular plants. Plant them in fall, so they're established by summer.

### IMPORTANT SERVICE GUIDELINES

Please do not place items within 6 feet of any obstacles such as gas or water meters, telephone service boxes, overhead wires of any kind, parked cars, building overhangs, etc... In order to help achieve recycling goals please place your brush and bulky items in separate piles.

### Recycling Program Laguna Vista Proof of Residency

If you live and/or own property in Laguna Vista, you are eligible to use our weekly recycling services.

A recycling truck is available every Saturday at Roloff Park from 8:00am – 12:00pm (or whenever the truck gets full – so we suggest coming early).

Beginning **November 1**, **2024** only vehicles with a proof of residency sticker will be permitted to drop off their recycling at the Laguna Vista recycle location.

### Two (2) stickers will be provided per household/business.

Proof of Residency forms can be obtained from our website (HERE) or at City Hall. You will need the following items to complete the form:

### RESIDENT/LOCAL BUSINESS:

- Drivers License/Passport (cannot be expired);
- 2) A current utility bill or copy of rental lease as proof of residency; and
- License plate number, make, model and color of each vehicle.

Proof of Residency Stickers will be issued within 7 days of form submission.

There is no cost for the stickers; however, as noted above, without the sticker you will NOT be permitted to drop off your recycling AFTER November 1, 2024.


